Proceedings

Brad called the meeting to order at 1:03 pm.

1. Consent Agenda

- a. The agenda was reviewed.
- b. Minutes from the June meeting were reviewed.
- c. The financial report was reviewed.
- d. Voucher S.Gen.06258 in the amount of \$4086.60 was reviewed.
- e. Voucher S.LS.0625 in the amount of \$1267.04 was reviewed.
- f. Voucher S.Gen.0725 in the amount of \$5120.00 was reviewed.
- g. Voucher S.Gen.0825 in the amount of \$15,039.64 was reviewed.
- Andy moved to approve the consent agenda. Al seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

2. Administration

a. AWB budget work plan was discussed.

3. FEMA Projects

- a. Gavin gave a FEMA update.
 - i. The state and FEMA are in talks about already allocated funds.
 - There are ongoing challenges with obligated A&E funds. The State is in discussions with FEMA. While Construction will move forward, engineering is currently on hold.

4. Ag Water Board / Water Supply

- a. Gavin gave an adjudication update.
- b. There was a good turn out to the hearing in Lynden on September 8, 2025.

- 6000 landowners need to be served. This will take place by public docket in a county newspaper.
- Ecology will have to notify all landowners that all future notices will be by public docket.
 Landowners will be responsible for staying informed. Postcards with this info are expected to be sent by the end of October.
- iii. The state budget came out. \$600,000 was requested for technical support. \$200,000 was given. \$1.4 million was requested and granted for court capital costs. \$200,000 was requested and denied for settlement costs. Roughly \$2.8 million was requested and denied for court operating costs. Ecology received all the funds requested.
- c. Judge will not allow motions to be filed until all landowners are served.

5. Drainage / Habitat / Flood

- a. Fred gave a FLIP update.
 - FLIP is recognizing that Widen the Funnel will move more sediment downstream, so they
 are looking at extending that work further downstream.
- b. WCFCZD is using WID permit to clean Johnson Creek south of Main St.
- c. Ditch spray was discussed.
 - i. Gavin will connect with landowner on Osgood Ditch to do ditch spray.
- d. Beaver management was discussed.
 - i. If anyone hears of anything, let Gavin know.
- e. Fred shared about a recent Forest tour.
 - i. Fred mentioned recent developments in riparian buffers in working forest lands.
 - ii. Forest practices board is looking to further restrict logging adjacent to NP-type streams

6. Water Quality

- a. No current update.
- Fred noted a recent Cascadia Daily article about air pollution from farms. The article had numerous errors.

7. Next Meeting

a. Next scheduled meeting is October 7 at 1:00 pm.
